KERAMIKOS-TECHNOPOLIS-IERA ODOS

The aim is to redesign the public space in order to facilitate a better connection between the urban districts that lie on either side of Pireos Street. Also, consideration must be given to the following:

- the end of the pedestrian walk of Ermou Street
- the connection of the archaeological site of the ancient cemetery of Keramikos with the life of the city and the axis of Iera Odos (Ancient 'Sacred Way')
- the existing shed for the parking of the trolley buses, which can be kept and refurbished or removed
- the Technopolis/Old Gasworks site and finally
- the bridge over the Metro line, which serves as the only connection to the hill of the old Observatory.











PIREOS STREET- KOUMOUNDOUROU SQUARE-PSIRI DISTRICT

Koumoundourou Square and its connecting ends to the other side of Pireos Street and the area of Psiri are to be examined together as one entity. The unbuilt plots as well as the surrounding the square streets also form part of the intervention. The large IKA building which fronts the square on Pireos Street must be considered either as a converted building, which through its uses will breathe new life to the area, or if demolished offer more free public space.







GERANI DISTRICT-THEATRE SQUARE-ATHINAS STREET

This is the area of the C19th Central City Market, the underground parking space with the raised public area above it, across the street from the Market, and the Theatre Square (Plateia Theatrou), a so-called street, leading off from the parking to the west and to the building of the Diplarios School. The main axis of Athinas Street cuts through this area and is a direct link between the Acropolis and Omonia Square. Gerani is one of the most degraded areas in Central Athens and is the home of a large number of both legal and illegal migrants, mainly because of the presence of the numerous small shops and businesses, that used and still operate here.















KORAI STREET-KLATHMONOS SQUARE-KARITSI SQUARE-SAINT THEODORES CHURCH

The area that stretches from the C19th Athenian Neoclassical Trilogy of the National University, National Library and Academy buildings down to Klathmonos and Karitsi Squares and the small Byzantine church of Agioi Theodori (Saint Theodores). The unbuilt plots, the side streets and the arcades (stoas in Greek) are to be considered as well. On the SE side of Klathmonos Square is the City of Athens Museum and around the corner from Karitsi Square is the First Parliament House of the Modern Greek State, now housing the National Historical Museum.













ERMOU, MITROPOLEOS AND PHILELLINON STREETS-SYNTAGMA SQUARE

This particular area includes the lower part of Syntagma Square, spanning the space from Stadiou Street to Philellinon Street. Syntagma Square is the main Political space of the city of Athens, as it fronts the Parliament House (it used to be the Royal Palace when Greece became a kingdom, after the Revolution of 1821 and the War of Independence against the Turks). All political rallies and major demonstrations usually take place here. This part of the square is cut off from the rest of the city and the busy pedestrian street of Ermou, mostly because of the traffic. How to establish links, without necessarily banning all cars from the area, by redesigning the public space is the main consideration.

ATOY KONSTANTINOY ANOLYFEY ANOLYFE

TOWN HALL-KOTZIA SQUARE-ATHINAS STREET

The sober neoclassical building of the Town Hall with some leftover open spaces around it at one end and the group of buildings of the National Bank of Greece at the other, face each other across Kotzia square. Athinas street intervenes between the Town Hall and the square. A sunken archaeological dig is cut off from the square floor like a gaping wound. A small triangular plot at the crossing of Eolou and Stadiou streets - could it be used as forecourt to the square itself? How can this forgotten square be reconnected to its surroundings and hence to the rest of the city?



















AG. KONSTANTINOU SQUARE-NATIONAL THEATRE

The beautiful church of Saint Constantine (Agios Konstantinos) sits in an abandoned square across the Ag. Konstantinou street from the National Theatre. The area has followed the degradation of Omonia $Square\ and\ the\ nearby\ Metaxourgio\ district.\ The\ aim\ is\ to\ try\ and\ connect\ together\ the\ two\ parts\ of\ the$ city separated by Ag. Konstantinou Street, as well as revitalise the neighbourhood. The theatre building has been restored and it is the only beacon for attracting people from other parts of the city to this area.









ATHINAS AND ERMOU STREETS-MONASTIRAKI DISTRICT

The Monastiraki Square forms the crossing of two major streets in Central Athens: the pedestrianised Ermou, which continues to the west and Athinas street which ends here. It is also the heart of the Medieval city, signified by the crossing of the two streets of the Neoclassical C19th city plan, implemented by the Bavarian King Otto, the 1 st King of the Modern Greek State. It is a very lively area for the young people and the tourists and the traffic is extremely problematic on all days of the week. How to deal with this problem and at the same time not destroy its character is the aim of this intervention.
